

In the event of cancellation, the following amounts are non-refundable:



Ages 6-86

Riding daily at Trax North in Crosby, MIN, located about 25 minutes from camp, this track is just over a mile long and includes whoops, doubles and step ups. We will have several Motocross professionals to teach campers of all ages how to win races. After a long day of training, campers come back to Trout to swim, wakeboard, zipline and all kinds of activities. This is a one of a kind camp that motocrossers will not want to miss! OUR GOAL

It is our goal to create and maintain a safe and caring environment where individuals can come to know Jesus Christ as their personal Savior and grow in their understanding of His love for them. It is our hope that a camper's confidence, self-esteem, personal skills and relationships will expand and develop while at Trout Lake Camps. We believe that a good camp experience should foster a love for God, life-long skills, and friendships that last for years to come.

Staff Qualifications

Staff are chosen on the basis of their personal commitment to Jesus Christ, maturity, character, and love for children. After completing an extensive application, all applicants take part in a thorough interview, have three references examined, take the MinistrySafe Program and undergo a criminal record check. All camp staff members also take part in an intensive training program that prepares them for this important responsibility.

Program Safety

Health and safety of campers is important at Trout Lake Camps. A camp nurse is on hand at all times during the summer. American Red Cross lifeguards are on duty whenever swimming or boating activities take place. Certified riding instructors direct horsemanship activities. Riflery, archery and climbing activities are led by qualified instructors who know and love their sport and understand how to teach it safely.

Campers have the opportunity to participate in many fun and exciting activities based on the camp they attend. Please be aware that some activities will require an additional fee. These activities include some craft projects (\$5 and up), paintball (\$12), water skiing, tubing & wakeboarding (\$12) and afternoon trail rides (\$12). Primary/Primary Plus activities include swimming, canoeing, BB guns, team sports, horse rides in the corral, crafts, minigolf, sling shot, and archery. Junior campers participate in many of the same activities with the addition of tubing, wakeboarding, sailing, shark rides and blobbing, zipline, climbing wall, and riflery. They also have an opportunity to take a horsemanship class. Young Teens campers have all the activities available at Timber Ridge including pottery, 4-line zipline, Leap of Faith, mountain bikes/scooters, flying squirrel, and indoor climbing to name a few. Senior High campers have the opportunity to do it all. All activities are subject to weather and schedule changes.

In addition to the activities listed above, we also open our camp store, canteen, Soda Fountain and Barn during free time and campers are allowed to purchase snacks, T-shirts, sweatshirts, and souvenirs.

Junior, Young Teens and Senior High campers have the opportunity to sign up for the horsemanship skills class. Junior and Senior High horse

manship classes take

place during

the morning skills class period. Young Teens are in the afternoon. Campers learn about caring for horses and basic riding skills through corral and trail rides. To register for horsemanship skills class, please check this option on the camp registration form and include an additional \$75. Horsemanship classes are assigned on a first-come, first-served basis according to when registrations arrive in our office. Trail rides are offered every afternoon for everyone and sign-ups are available (\$12) from the camp office each morning. Primary and Primary Plus campers will be given free corral rides each week (weather permitting).



Camp is for Everyone

In the operation of all of our camping programs, no child will be discriminated against because of race, color, age, sex, disability or national origin. > Cabin Friends Policy:

If there is anyone that you would like to be in the same cabin with, we will do our best to make sure you are together. Trout works very hard to protect the overall dynamics within a cabin, therefore we do not put more than four campers together that have requested each other. If your child is part of a group of 5 or more friends, we will organize them into smaller groupings and place them in nearby cabins. It is always best that cabin friends specifically list each other when registering for camp. On occasion, a group of 10 or more cabin friends may fill an entire cabin.

A "closed group" is a group of four campers who have all exclusively selected each other. This prevents other campers from dividing this group of four, so please think this through carefully.

Cancellations

If you need to cancel your registration, please contact us quickly since some camps are full and do have waiting lists. Keep in mind that a portion of your fee is non-refundable depending on the date of your cancellation.

Many camps fill up as early as February. Registrations are processed as they arrive in our office or online. Be aware that registrations received online may be processed more quickly than those mailed or faxed. Either way you will want to register as early as possible. Family camp registrations may not be postmarked or faxed before February 1.
