

Planning Checklist

Review this registration packet and decide whether your group will attend.

Calculate budget costs for the weekend, including transportation and meals. We suggest adding about \$15-\$18 per meal. Many groups bring supplies for meals and some hotels offer continental breakfast. Run the numbers to figure out how much to charge your students, factoring in your leader's cost if necessary.

Get information into the hands of your students by the middle of January.

Cost: \$65 per person (leaders and students)

Conference Sessions

Each conference session includes worship, student-led prayer, and Bible messages, centered around our theme of "Mash-Up." They will also include other interactive elements as well. Students will find these sessions fun, encouraging, and challenging.

Please begin praying now for our speakers and worship leaders who will be leading these sessions.

Seminars/Workshops

We desire students to go deeper in their faith and knowledge of Jesus Christ. Because of this, we are offering a number of different seminars and workshops that will encourage them to live out their faith in all areas of their life.

Students and leaders can select two seminars/workshops that interest them (Saturday from 11:30 am-12:30 pm and then 6:00-7:00 pm). A list of all the available seminars/workshops will be included in the confirmation packets. You are able to review these with your students prior to the conference.

Breakout Sessions

Following each of the rallies, groups will have a time to meet to discuss and interact with what they just learned. We have a limited number of rooms, so larger groups will be assigned spaces. You may want to check with your hotel about open meeting spaces prior to your arrival.

Afternoon Activity Options & Ministry Projects

You and your youth groups will have the opportunity to help local churches and ministries by providing various services for them. We will have 300-500 spots available.

All projects will last approximately 90 minutes, including drive time (if necessary). More details on these opportunities will be available in your confirmation packet around April 10th.

Inflatables & Laser Tag - We have a couple free activity options at the DECC on Saturday afternoon, if your group would rather hang out with our staff at the DECC for the afternoon.

Prayer Time

About 45 minutes prior to each rally, we will have a time set aside for students and leaders that want to commit our rally time to the Lord. This time is spent in both large group and small group prayer. We will also have students that will pray for our rallies on stage during each session. Please consider finding someone in your youth ministry that is willing to start a prayer team prior to the conference.

"Be Still, Know God" Prayer Event

Want to help your students reach a new level of getting to know God through prayer as well as preparing their hearts for what God will do during District Blitz? Bring them to our "Be Still, Know God" prayer event in the DECC from 1:00-3:00 pm on Friday, April 28. There will be worship and prayer individually and in small groups. This event is designed to help students embrace intimacy with God through prayer and to learn different ways to pray. We can't really think of a better way to begin your District Blitz weekend!

Note: This event is optional, but if you're able to come, we suggest eating an early lunch. This way you can be at the DECC by noon. ("Get-Out-Of-School-Early" forms are available on page 16). The event will run until 3:00 pm, at which time you will have a chance to check into your hotel, eat dinner, and then make your way to the conference registration area.

Meals

All groups will be responsible for their own meals while at the conference. Some hotels offer a continental breakfast and/or have refrigerators in the rooms. There are several fast-food locations in the area, however, you may need transportation to get to them. There are grocery stores and pizza places that are less than 2 miles away.

PLEASE NOTE: THERE IS A NATION-WIDE LABOR SHORTAGE AFFECTING THE STAFFING AT HOTELS AND RESTAURANTS. With this in mind, we STRONGLY recommend that you establish a meal plan for all your meals. We recommend making restaurant reservations TWO WEEKS PRIOR TO THE EVENT. And please be patient with the restaurants trying to serve thousands of kids with little staff.

Parking/Transportation

Most of our blocked hotels are within walking distance to the DECC. Check a map to ensure your hotel is within walking distance. To keep your parking costs to a minimum, we recommend that you arrange for parking at your hotel and utilize the Skyway system. The parking lot at the conference location will have enough parking spaces to accommodate all vehicle types, including buses and trailers. Each time you have a vehicle enter the DECC parking lot you will have to pay a parking fee. We are currently negotiating reduced parking fee with the Duluth Visitors Bureau for our conference participants. You will have the option of parking your vehicles overnight at the DECC for the entirety of the weekend

Health Forms & Medical Personnel


All students and leaders are required to bring a completed copy of the enclosed health form. These will be collected at registration. We understand you may have your own health forms, but we require the conference specific form. There will be certified medical personnel present at all locations and our largest hotels. In the event of an emergency, it would be best to call 911 or go directly to the hospital.

Head Youth Leader Orientation

The focus of this weekend is to minister to students. We trust leaders will set the example by following conference rules and encourage their students to do the same. The head youth leader for your group must attend a brief orientation on Friday, during the first rally (See schedule). This will be the time when we review rules, expectations, schedules, and answer any questions. We will have the rules and expectations printed in your conference handbook.

Subsequently, Deyo released four more acclaimed worship recordings, "Saturate," "Light," "Surrender," (Live), and "Unveil." "Moving Mountains, his fifth and newest full-length worship album (2012), blends pop rock sounds with soulful grooves and striking melodies, enriched by meaningful lyrics and modern

congregational expressions in songs like "We Delight," "Rescue Me," and "Eternity," as well as the salient title track. He also regularly contributes original songs to the most recent NCU Worship Live recordings: "Glory to God," "Hearts on Fire," "Always Remain," "Breath of Heaven," including singles like "You Will Be Our God" produced by Deyo for North Central University.

1. As Soon As Possible:

Familiarize yourself with the Conference Information Overview.

Make hotel reservations at local hotels. We have provided you with a list that is offering better than public rates. But some hotels fill quickly so time is of the essence.

2. Between February 2 and April 28:

Register your group between February 2 and April 28 (see page 4 for details).

Add additional students to your group until April 28 (\$15 late fee applies from April 21 - April 28).

*Remember, registration fees are transferable within your youth group, but non-refundable.

Look for a confirmation packet that will be mailed to you two weeks prior to the conference, that includes maps and recreation information.

3. Sometime Before April 28:

Make sure all of your students, parents and leaders are familiar with the Conduct Code and Responsibility Pledge (p. 19).

4. On April 28:

On-site check-in will be from 6:00-8:30 pm on Friday, April 28, in the registration area, at DECC. The head youth leader should come and check in your church. Please bring a copy of your Group Registration Sign-up Sheet, with the exact number of students and leaders in your group and one complete set of health forms for your group.

Hotel Information

You are responsible for securing housing arrangements at one of the local hotels. Pages 16 and 17 have information on the hotels that have blocked off a certain number of rooms for us at our conference rate. You can see the number of rooms blocked, cost per room, and other information here.
